Improvement Initiatives Rationale

Growth in the area of writing (Naplan) has been inconsistent throughout the years. The staff feel that the implementation of a consistent writing program, teamed with targeted assessment is required to address this.

Although an improvement has been noted in our student opinion surveys, it would be beneficial to consolidate and build on the changes that have been made in this area.

Staff have identified the high impact teaching strategies of feedback, learning intentions and success criteria as an area for focus in 2018 - the self evaluation confirms this.

Panton Hill Primary has had a significant change in staff in 2017. As our leading teacher has taken the principal role, and with the appointment of two graduate teachers, we need to strategically provide training opportunities to existing staff to fill roles with further responsibilities and leadership roles.
