Principal's Report

You will notice that this newsletter is a little different to our normal format. This week, each teacher/grade has contributed an item. The reason for this is two fold. Over the next two days I will be involved in being a 'challenge partner' at Diamond Creek Primary School's school review. Come join us for a fabulous night! Don't forget to RSVP, as this is essential!



Outside School Hours Care News

**Important Information for OSHC parents **

Instructions to receive the Child Care Subsidy (CCS)

- See either Deb or Zoe to enrol for OSHC. You will require the primary carer's CRN and the child's CRN. Once enrolled you will receive an email welcoming you to Xplor. You will be required to download the Xplor app to you phone. The app is used <u>only to make bookings</u> for care.
- You are required to access <u>web.myxplor.com</u> on your computer to approve your child's enrolment at Panton Hill Primary OSHC service. Click on 'CCS Agreements' to <u>sign</u> your child's <u>Complying Written Agreement</u> (CWA). This step is necessary for the enrolment to migrate to Mygov.
- 3. The next day access your Mygov account, select Panton Hill OSHC to approve your child's enrolment to the service. On Mygov select Centrelink—Claims—Claims Family—CCS (first option).
- 4. You will also need to do the <u>required activity test.</u> The activity test calculates your percentage of entitlement to the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) which is applied to your account.

You will NOT receive the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) until you have completed all of the

required steps above.
