




"Acting locally and thinking Globally" Diamond Valley Singers will donate proceeds from the performances to International Needs Australia and Open House in Ivanhoe.

Can I buy tickets at the door?

All tickets must be purchased prior via the trybooking link below. No ticket sales will be available at the door.

Can I bring my kids?

This is a night to let loose and relive the 80's amongst adults, so tickets are available to over 18's only.

What do I need to bring?

- Nibbles, snacks, platters to share on your table or organize to have food delivered
- Table decorations dig out your 80's tableware, orange Tupperware as there's a prize for the best dressed table
- Your outfit
- Your ticket (paper or electronic is ok)
- Gold coins we'll have a few competitions throughout the night, so be sure to bring your spare change along

Can I bring drinks?

Please note that we do not have a BYO license, so all drinks must be purchased at the bar. We will have a fully stocked bar for you to purchase all types of drinks including non-alcoholic drinks.
