This week, on Wednesday we were lucky enough to have Matthew Meredith-Williams (Elowyn's father) spend the morning visiting the classrooms and speaking to all our students about his work as an archaeologist. Armed with skulls, skeletons and all sorts of ancient stone tools, he kept our students fascinated with a history of early humans.

These talks also had links to the students' current unit of study on Geography. I was fascinated to sit in on the session with the Preps—grade 2's and was very proud of the level of curiosity that our students showed and the great questions and discussion that came afterwards.

We have heard that many of the kids went home and passed on their new knowledge to their parents! Thankyou so much Matt for the time spent in both the preparation and the delivery of the talks. It seems we may now have a few budding archaeologists on our hands!

To register for the tests:

- Follow this link: https://pay.unswglobal.com.au/
- Type in the school ID number: 88b9d63944
- Fill in your child/ren's details. It will ask for an ID number which is not compulsory.
- Once registered, parents can pay for ICAS directly to UNSW Global until 14th August.

When you have registered, the school will be notified and in September the tests will be released to the school and we will organise for the students to sit the tests under our supervision.

Registrations for these tests close on Wednesday the 31st of July.
