On Wednesday this week, our Grade 6's took part in the Grade 6 Leadership Day. This is a great day, where our students have the opportunity to visit other local schools, get together with other Grade 6's and share and celebrate the leadership projects they have worked on throughout the year.

One of the benefits of the close relationship we have with our neighbouring small schools is that our students have many opportunities to meet other students of their age group. On the leadership day the students from all of the schools got together in their new secondary school groups, so that they all have a familiar face or two from our area.

LANDCARE AND BIODIVERSITY GRANT

We are really excited to have been granted approximately \$5000 towards a landcare and biodiversity project which we will be working on in 2020.

This grant was provided by the Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) and Landcare Australia. Ruth Marr (Rory Collin's mum) was largely responsible for finding and writing this submission.

This project will involve a hands on workshop for all grades, led by Leap Into Nature covering topics of threatened species, habitat, threats and management actions.

The second part of this project will be working in conjunction with the Council and Landcare volunteers in Wimbi Reserve (across the road) on works such as revegetation and the monitoring of threatened species, in particular the brush tailed phascogale. We will be installing nest boxes and monitoring them using cameras. During this process, students will be introduced to monitoring techniques and methods of data collection and analysis. There are numerous opportunities to use this real life experience in all aspects of the curriculum across all age levels.

GRADE 3/4 MARKET DAY STALL

On **Monday 21st October**, the grade 3/4's will be holding a baked market day stall. Their delicious delights will sell from 50cents to \$2.00. It is to be decided where the proceeds are to be spent.
