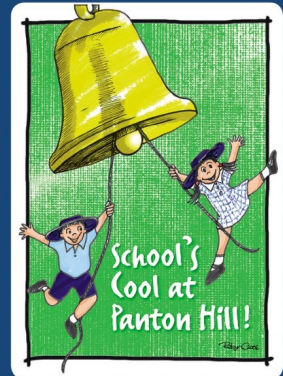

RESTRICTIONS
