Principal's Report

Whilst we have a very busy schedule for this term, we are also well into the process of planning for 2023. One of the exciting additions to what we are offering our community next year is the provision of a holiday program to run in school holidays, starting after Term 1 2023. We are able to offer this after having been successful in obtaining a government grant to establish the service. Our hope is that at the conclusion of the two year subsidised program, it will have built to the point where we can continue to provide it independently of the grant.

On Monday we had our second last School Council meeting for the year. We had Steve Baldock from Theircare join our meeting to discuss their Expression Of Interest to manage the holiday program. Our Grade 2 students in particular have been involved in the discussions about what their vision is for the area ... and believe me, they have a very clear and detailed vision! And congratulations also go to Maddie Gyngell who is a skilled ten pin bowler. Over the holidays she travelled to Queensland where she competed in a National Ten Pin Bowling competition. Over 8 days, Maddie bowled in 31 games. She was very successful, coming away with three 1st places, two second places and a fourth! 2023 PLANNING

As mentioned, planning is well underway for 2023. Our enrolments continue to be strong with a current enrolment of 24 Preps for next year. We are still receiving enquiries for enrolments throughout other grade levels which makes it difficult to settle on a confirmed grade structure yet.

As our rural funding is reduced to 50% next year (it was at 75% this year) we will be running with six grades. This gives us the capacity to employ a teacher aide to help out part time in the junior years, which will be an enormous help. This will also allow us to employ our tutor for extra days other than what we have been allocated by DET. Again this is a priority for us given the effectiveness of the tutor program with Rose this year.

Unfortunately we will be farewelling both Jaimi Darwell and Russell Smith next year who will be returning to their base schools. Although we are very excited for Jaimi whose focus next year will be firmly on welcoming her first baby.

We have advertised and appointed a new teacher who will be joining us in 2023. We will be welcoming Callum O'Connor to our staff who some of you may know in his capacity as a Panton Hill Junior Cricket Coach. Callum has previously undertaken a teaching placement with us in Prep and also happens to be one of our past students.

When we have the information we need to decide on the grade structure we will let parents know and we will go through the grade placement process where the students will be asked by their teachers to nominate children they would like to be with in 2023.

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Conversations will be had regarding what makes a good learning friend and the students will be able to nominate those friends who support their learning and reduce distractions. During the process the teachers will ensure that every child is with at least one of these.

Parent considerations are also collected via email and

considered during this process. Often parents have specific insights into student needs and this additional knowledge plays a significant part in how we structure our classes. These insights often include but are not limited to health, emotional or learning matters, peer or sibling relationships or changes in the home situation. Selecting a particular teacher does not fit within the realm of special circumstances. If parents want to provide extra personal information to be considered in the process we will be asking parents to please email the school office. Letters should be addressed to "The Principal" and a deadline will be provided.

Classroom teachers will consider where students will be best suited based on learning, behavioural and social needs and any relevant information they have gathered throughout the year. All of this information will then be used to develop the 2023 classes.

SCHOOL CONCERT



Our school concert this year will be held on **Tuesday December 6th**, starting at **5:30pm**. We are really hoping that the weather will be kind to us and that we can hold it at the Panton Hill Memorial Park. Our back up plan is that we move to the hall if we need.
