

You may remember that last term, as part of our focus on numeracy, we asked parents/guardians to complete a survey about their experiences of/attitudes towards numeracy. We have included the results and an explanation of this survey for your information. Thankyou to all of those parents who participated in this survey. As a staff we spent time examining these results and completed a similar survey about our own dispositions. This work is out of recognition that it is not uncommon for some students to feel some anxiety around maths. One of the factors which can contribute to this is the messaging they are hearing from the adults around them, particularly teachers and parents.

PREMIERS READING CHALLENGE

The Premier's Reading Challenge has once again started.

Our aim at PHPS every year is to have 100% of our students complete the challenge.

Year 3-6 students Read 15 books – including 10 or more from the Challenge Book List

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Parent Survey for dispositions towards Mathematics

These are the results of our *Parent Survey Towards Maths* that was collected throughout Term One. A big thankyou to all parents who shared and participated in the survey.

The results have been used to give staff a strong understanding of the dispositions parents in our school have towards Maths, how we can use this information to guide our teaching practices in the classroom and to identify areas of need for parents in supporting Maths at home.

We have collated the results by noting the **amount of parents** who scored in a particular category. For example, a 3 may be placed in the 'number 2' column to represent three parents who scored a 2 for the particular question or statement.

We had a total of 30 parents when collating the results.


