BUILDING WORKS

You may have noticed the building works happening at the moment in our main building. Unfortunately, we had a leak just before the resumption of the school year resulting in the removal of some carpet, plaster and floorboards. The works are currently at the stage where the area has needed to be sealed off. I am told that the works should be completed before the end of this term. Hopefully we will have access to the stairs within the next two weeks.

CURRICULUM UPDATE

You may have been aware of quite a few Casual Relief Teachers in the school recently. We are in the process of transitioning to a different reading system in our Grade P-2. This is an evidence based, systematic phonics system designed to best support all students. In order to implement this with the most effectiveness, we have committed to significant professional development for our staff, resulting in days spent out of the classroom. We are very excited about this and believe that it will further improve the teaching and learning at PHPS.

Alongside this, we have also had mandated early years literacy testing for our Grade 1's. This has required our Grade 1 teachers to have their grades covered while they administered the testing one on one to their students.

This Sunday, March 3rd is "Grandmother's Day". If you are lucky enough to have your grandmother, give her lots of love and kisses! ©


Coming up on March 8th we have a Pupil Free Day with the theme of "The Mad Hatter's Tea


