

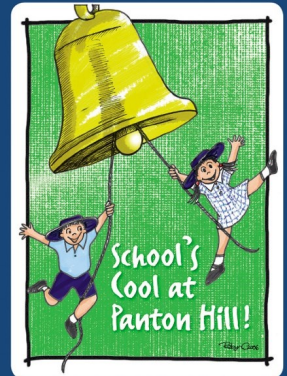

2. Additional Child Care Subsidy

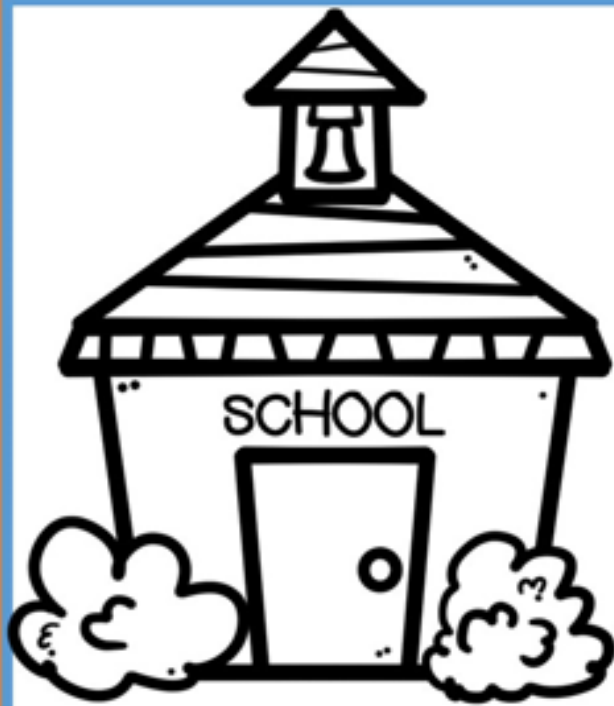
This is extra support for some families including:

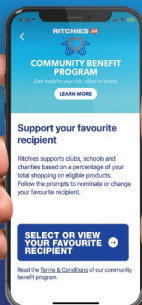
